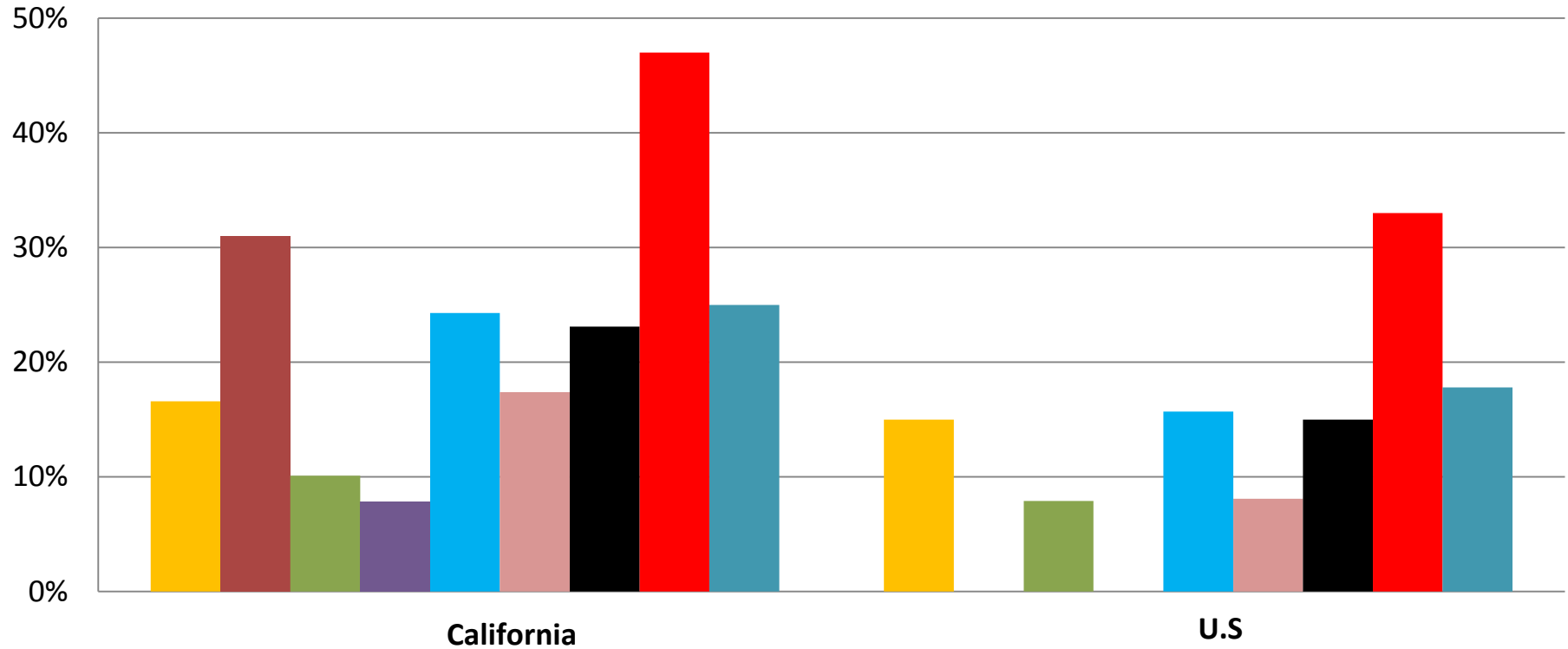
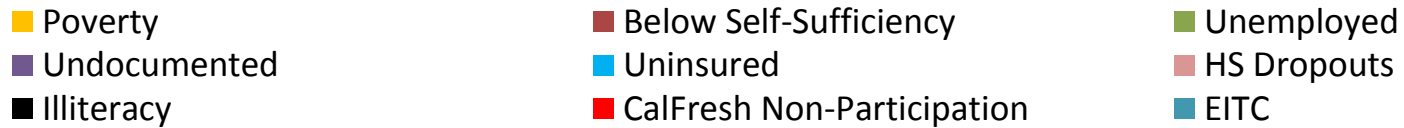
*The tables below provide the following data for each county in California, grouped by local Catholic Charities Agency:*

<b>Total population:</b>	Estimates of population by county and statewide for June 2013. (U.S. Census Bureau)
<b>Living below the federal poverty line:</b>	This statistic is defined as the number of people with income at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines in 2012. (U.S. Census Bureau)
<b>Cost of Living:</b>	Number and percent of households below the self-sufficiency standard. The self-sufficiency standard is a county-by-county measure of the cost of living; households below this standard do not have sufficient income to cover basic expenses like childcare, transportation, healthcare, and food.
<b>Unemployed:</b>	The number and percent of people in California who were unemployed as of January 2013, out of the total Civilian Labor Force (N = 18.5 million, statewide). (U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics and California Employment Development Department)
<b>Undocumented:</b>	Number of Unauthorized Immigrants in California – Estimates for Counties. NOTE: Some county data, due to small population size, was not included in the counts, but are combined here for reporting purposes. Amador, Calaveras, Tuolumne, Mariposa, Alpine, Mono, Inyo = 2,500 or 1.4% of total population; Colusa, Glenn, Tehama, Trinity = 10,000 or 8.3% of total population; Del Norte, Siskiyou, Modoc, Lassen = 1,000 or 1.0% of total population; Mendocino, Lake = 8,000 or 5.0% of total population; Monterey, San Benito = 62,000 or 13.5% of total population; Plumas, Sierra, Nevada = 2,000 or 1.5% of total population; Sutter, Yuba = 9,000 or 5.6% of total population.
<b>Uninsured:</b>	County-by-county estimates of the number of California residents without health insurance. NOTE: Some county data, due to small population size, was combined for the purposes of these counts.
<b>Homelessness:</b>	Point-in-time count of the number and percent of individuals in each county who were homeless (sheltered and unsheltered) on a given night, from the Assessment of Homelessness Annual Report (AHAR) to Congress 2010, published by HUD in 2011. NOTE: This data is not available for every county and some counties were combined for the purposes of these counts. Therefore the data is not presented in the graph.
<b>High School Dropout Rates:</b>	Dropouts by grades 9 through 12 in the state of California for year of 2011-2012. The 4-year derived dropout rate is an estimate of the percent of students who would drop out in a four year period based on data collected for a single year.
<b>Adults Lacking Basic Prose</b>	Indirect estimate of the percentages of adults lacking Basic Prose Literacy Skills (BPLS) in 2003 for each county in California. County indirect estimates were produced applying small area estimation techniques that use a statistical model to relate the

<b>Literacy Skills (BPLS):</b>	estimated percentage of adults lacking BPLS in a county with sample members to predictor variables available from external sources. (National Center for Education Statistics)
<b>Eligible for CalFresh but not participating:</b>	2010 estimate of the number of individuals who are income eligible but not participating in CalFresh, calculated according to the formula below. (California Food Policy Advocates). Program Access Index is the participation rate as calculated by CFPA. $(\# \text{ Of Income-Eligible Individuals}) \times (1 - \text{Program Access Index}^*) = \# \text{ of Income-Eligible Non-Participants.}$
<b>Eligible for EITC but not receiving:</b>	Number of tax returns eligible for EITC but not receiving; based on EITC Payments to California Residents, and Estimated Unclaimed EITC Payments, by County and Selected Cities (2010). (IRS) <i>* Percentage = non-participating eligibles out of total eligibles. Total eligibles = EITC returns + estimated unclaimed EITC returns.</i>
<b>Obesity:</b>	2009 Age-adjusted estimates of the number and percentage of adults over 19 years of age who are obese in California.
<b>Life Expectancy:</b>	Life expectancy by gender by county. (2013)
